### d. CENTER FOR TECHNOLOGY




























#### LIBRARY ADVISORY COMMITTEE 2022-2023

#### REMEDIAL COACHING REPORT 2022-2023

National College aims at imparting quality teaching and learning to learners from diverse backgrounds which gets enrolled to the institution. The learning interest and pace of each student is different. In other words, there are both slow learners and advanced learners. In such a situation, it is very important to identify the learners and plan accordingly to deliver student oriented teaching-learning.

Remedial classes for students of various Departments were held during the academic year for slow learners. Students have benefited from these remedial classes. Progress of these students were monitored closely after every internal examination by the concerned Mentor, who identifies further issues if any, relating to understanding and absorption levels which is communicated to the concerned teacher. These classes have been extremely beneficial for the students as they could clarify their doubts and have a better understanding of the lessons conceptually. Teachers also help during free periods if required.



#### > Department of Botany and Biotechnology

At the entry level, the students were assessed on the basis of their performance in Learners Aptitude Test, preceding examination, interest in chosen current subject, involvement in classroom teaching-learning, and learning pace of students. After the identification of the learners, the Department prepared a schedule accordingly and allotted topics to the faculty members. The students and the teachers were notified about the schedule and details of remedial classes. Remedial classes were conducted regularly for the identified slow learners, as per the schedule. During these classes, additional study materials were also arranged by the faculty for the students to bridge the knowledge gap and enable them to cope with the academic course to which they are enrolled.



## Specific steps adopted for slow learners:

- 1. Tutorials, discussions, interactions and remedial coaching.
- 2. Concept clarification and problem solving exercises.
- 3. Bilingual explanations and discussions.
- 4. Provision for simplified but standard lecture notes/course material.
- 5. Revision of topics and practical.
- 6. Enhancement of communication skills and art of reading-learning.

#### > Department of Electronics and PCA

The mentors regularly conducted meetings regarding progress of their mentees and identified students who secured less than 50 per cent marks in their internals and class tests. The mentors evaluated the progress card of the students who scored below 50 per cent marks and below 75 per cent attendance. They were considered as academically weak students and intimated to their parents.

Identification Criteria	Actions taken
Students scoring less than 50 per cent of marks in Internal Assessment.	Mentor monitored their progress regularly and advising them about attending classes, making up classes missed, and getting additional help.

#### **Activities for slow learners**

- 1. Special Coaching class for slow learners.
- 2. Provided handwritten notes for easy understanding.
- 3. Counseling for slow learners.
- 4. Group study methodology.
- 5. Giving additional learning materials like question bank, University question papers





#### Other activities

- 1. Conducted weekly class test for one hour.
- 2. Evaluated class test answer sheets and prepared the class test result report of the class.
- 3. Prepared and maintained a report for the whole class based on parameters decided for assessment of the learning levels of the students.
- 4. Prepared separate list of slow and advanced learners
- 5. Prepared schedule for extra sessions /problem solving sessions / revision sessions for slow learners.
- 6. Conducted the sessions for slow learners as per the prepared schedule.
- 7. Maintained the attendance of slow learner's sessions.
- 8. Prepared the list of advanced assignment or list of tasks assigned to advanced learners.

#### > Department of Biochemistry and Industrial Microbiology

- 1. Ten questions from each module (University exam repeated questions) were given to students as assignments.
- 2. Online revision classes given through class groups
- 3. Animated Science videos were given to them.
- 4. Short simple notes were provided.

#### > Department of Social Work

Remedial measures for undergraduate (UG) students were designed to provide additional support and assistance to those who were facing challenges in their academic performance. These measures intended to help students improve their understanding of the subject matter and enhance their overall learning experience.

#### > Department of Computer Science

The Department conducted remedial classes to support and uplift students who were struggling academically. The primary objective was to identify weak students and provide them with comprehensive revision using previous year question papers.

**Identification of Weak Students:** The Department carefully analyzed the academic performance of the students and identified those who were facing difficulties in their studies.

**Revision with Previous Year Question Papers:** The selected students were provided with focused revision sessions, utilizing previous year question papers. This approach aimed to reinforce their understanding of crucial concepts and improve their exam preparation.

**Results:** The remedial classes yielded promising outcomes.

**Motivational Approach:** Throughout the process, the Department maintained a positive and encouraging atmosphere. Students were motivated to believe in their abilities and the potential to overcome academic challenges.

**Special Online Classes:** To cater to the diverse learning needs of students, special online classes were introduced. These classes provided flexible learning opportunities, allowing students to access educational content at their convenience.

#### > Department of English

Students who performed poorly in the examinations were identified and remedial measures were initiated to help them improve in weak subjects. Supportive classes were held by the teachers concerned, for facilitating those students to overcome learning difficulties. Such classes were effective in bringing out the expected results. The chart shown below details the classes arranged by the Department and the resultant improvement achieved there upon.

#### > Department of Commerce

The Department conducted a series of remedial classes during the academic year aimed at providing additional support and academic assistance to students those who facing challenges in various subjects. The primary objective of the remedial classes was to help struggling students improve their understanding of the subjects and boost their academic performance. The Department aimed to create a conducive learning environment that would cater to individual learning needs and enhance overall success of students.

The remedial classes were conducted over a period on a continuous basis with the help of blended learning support who insisted the slow learners to utilize offline classes along with supportive online resources. The class was divided into different unique groups including equal proportions of fast learners, slow learners and average learners. A WhatsApp group was created and assigned a group leader to coordinate the group. A topic was assigned to each member and online classes and discussions were carried out by the concerned member.

The remedial classes which included the failed students covered a range of topics in commerce during the ongoing semester. The Department employed a variety of teaching methodologies to engage students effectively. These include interactive discussions, practical exercises, case studies, and one-on-one mentoring sessions with qualified instructors. Additionally, digital learning resources and educational technology tools were utilized to enhance the learning experience.

#### **Attendance and Participation:**

The attendance and participation of students were consistently monitored throughout the remedial classes. Regular attendance was encouraged to ensure maximum benefit from the program. Students actively participated in class activities, asked questions, and collaborated with their peers to foster a supportive learning environment. To track the progress of each student, periodic assessments and evaluations were conducted. These assessments were designed to identify areas of improvement and tailor the teaching approach accordingly. Continuous feedback was provided to students to help them understand their strengths and weaknesses. The remedial classes yielded positive outcomes, with many students showing significant improvement in their subject comprehension and performance. A notable increase in confidence levels was observed among participants, motivating them to overcome academic challenges. The Department of remedial classes proved to be an essential intervention in supporting academic growth of the students. The success of the program can be attributed to the dedication of both students and faculty members involved in creating an enriching learning experience. The Department further aims to expand and improve the remedial classes, ensuring that every student receives the necessary support to excel in their academic journey.

#### **TOURISM CLUB 2023**

The Tourism Club of the National College Unit was formed on April 18, 2023, as per the instructions from the Tourism department, Kerala Government aiming at fostering interest in tourism, identifying future tourism professional and promoting tourism destinations through innovative marketing strategies.
